'Our Water Story' Exhibit

As Singapore celebrates its 60th birthday this year, 'Our Water Story' exhibit serves as a timely reminder for everyone to reflect on the evolution of Singapore's Water Story and how it has supported our economic growth and development.

A small and young country with limited land area and water resources, Singapore faced immense challenges in securing our water supply in the early years of independence. The exhibit presents some of these challenges and highlights how our pioneers displayed an indomitable spirit and innovation to overcome them. Through sheer determination and resilience, our pioneers spearheaded many milestones in our water journey, including the successful cleanup of Singapore River, the completion of groundbreaking water infrastructure projects such as the Deep Tunnel Sewerage System (DTSS), as well as the introduction of additional weather-resilient National Taps – NEWater and desalination.

Our Water Story provides us with a glimpse of our journey in securing a resilient water supply. But our water journey is far from over. As we continue to chart our water journey, we must continue to channel the same indomitable spirit and determination as our pioneers in securing our water future.
