

## 4 Eco Walk at Jurong Lake Gardens by Micron

To celebrate Singapore's 60th independence anniversary and Singapore World Water Day, Micron Technologies (Micron) will lead a walk at Jurong Lake Gardens for Jurong Spring Constituency on 1 March. About 50 residents, including Adviser Shawn Huang, will join the eco-tour.

The walk highlights water conservation and sustainability in Singapore. Participants will learn about rainwater collection and importance of clean catchment areas as two-thirds of the land in Singapore channel rainwater to 17 reservoirs, including Jurong Lake. The tour at Jurong Lake Gardens will also celebrate the role of water in different aspects of Singaporean's lives by visiting the Floating Wetlands, the largest man-made floating wetlands in Singapore, and the Water Lily Garden, which is home to the largest collection of water lilies in Singapore, with over 150 water lily varieties.

The National Parks Board (NParks) supported the Micron docents by conducting demonstration tours and sharing content for them to conduct their tours.

# 5 STMicroelectronics Conducts Eco-tour for Elderly at Alkaff Lake and Bidadari Park

STMicroelectronics (ST) is organising an eco-tour to Alkaff Lake for seniors of Foundation of Rotary Clubs Singapore Active Ageing Centre (FRCS AAC) on 21 March. The tour aims to share with the participants about the new lake in the Bidadari estate, which serves as a multi-functional drainage infrastructure for stormwater management, enhancing flood protection for Bidadari estate and the surrounding areas. The tour will also explain how the lake transforms during dry and wet weather, contributing to the recreational and aesthetic community space while controlling stormwater runoff. Participants will gain an understanding of the importance of maintaining clean catchment areas in Singapore and the efforts made to ensure the sustainability of local catchment water.

ST employees will serve as guides, taking attendees around Alkaff Lake and parts of Bidadari Park. They were trained by PUB staff in January for this role and may conduct public tours in the future on suitable occasions. Rotary Club of Bugis Junction volunteers will also accompany FRCS AAC attendees.



# 6 YewTee Point Supports Singapore World Water Day with Month-Long Sustainability Campaign

YewTee Point is proud to return as a partner for Singapore World Water Day, with a series of engaging initiatives running from 1 to 31 March The mall will launch a sustainability campaign to commemorate both World Water Day and Earth Hour, offering shoppers a variety of activities designed to promote water conservation. # 10 PAssion Wave's Project Blue Wave Initiative Rallies Kayakers to Keep Our Catchments Clean

In collaboration with PUB and as part of Singapore World Water Day 2025, PAssion Wave @ Marina Bay and PAssion Wave @ Jurong Lake Gardens have organised Kayak 'N' Klean programmes for PUB's corporate partners throughout March 2025.

During the programme, PAssion Wave's trainers highlighted their Project Blue Wave initiatives and educated participants about the vital importance of maintaining clean catchments. They explained how two-thirds of Singapore's land area channels rainwater into 17 reservoirs through 8,000 km of rivers, canals and drains, emphasising the need to value and conserve water. Participants also learned fascinating details about Marina Reservoir, the Marina Barrage and Jurong Lake Gardens.

PAssion Wave's Kayak 'N' Klean programme, combines water sports with environmental conservation, encouraging participants to clean our reservoirs whilst fostering a sense of responsibility towards protecting our natural resources.

#### 20 Water Saving Projects at Collins Aerospace, an RTX business

Since 2019, as part of Raytheon's (RTX) sustainability initiative, Collins Aerospace has been leading water conservation efforts across its Singapore facilities, reaching over 1,600 employees island wide. The company's comprehensive approach to water conservation aligns with RTX's sustainability goals, which are implemented across all RTX facilities in Singapore.

Collins Aerospace has fostered a culture of active employee participation in water conservation through various channels. Employees contribute by reporting leakages and conducting water leakage inspections. Their proactive involvement has helped Collins Aerospace exceed RTX's water consumption targets through collaborative water-saving initiatives. Key technical innovations include recycling water from routine fire sprinkler



system testing and collecting Air Handling Unit (AHU) condensate for cooling tower water top-up.

In 2025, Collins Aerospace will host internal roadshows at both Bedok and Changi plants from February 24 to March 7. The roadshows will showcase the company's water conservation journey and feature educational materials to promote water conservation. Through these initiatives, Collins Aerospace and RTX remain committed to reducing water consumption, fostering a culture of environmental responsibility, and reinforcing its role in RTX's broader sustainability mission.

#### 21 Shimizu's various water conservation initiatives for SWWD

# NUS SAVE Tabletop Exercise to Promote Climate Resilience Awareness and Water Conservation

In support of Singapore World Water Day, NUS SAVE (Students' Association for Visions of the Earth) is organising a tabletop drought simulation exercise to promote climate resilience awareness and water conservation in NUS hostels. ### **Activities by Secondary Schools**

St. Andrew's Secondary School launches the Blue Trail: Leading Advocacy and Inspiring a Culture of Environmental Stewardship in Schools and Communities"

Building on the success of its signature *River Studies* programme (a two-year science signature program that fosters environmental stewardship). St. Andrew's Secondary School has launched the *Blue Trail* this year for SWWD2025, an expanded initiative that empowers the students to take their advocacy a step further by engaging fellow students, and the wider community. Through this initiative, St. Andrew's hopes to inspire a culture of environmental responsibility and encourage more schools and communities to take part in protecting Singapore's waterways.

2 Tanjong Katong Girls' School partners Geylang Methodist School (Primary) to explore Punggol Waterway

Tanjong Katong Girls' School (TKGS) students are collaborating closely with Geylang Methodist School Primary (GMS(P)) to guide and support their students in leading a learning trail at Punggol Waterway-Waterway Ridges. TKGS plays a key role in codeveloping the content with GMS(P), ensuring it is tailored to the younger participants. Through this partnership, TKGS students will model the way for GMS(P) students to eventually take ownership of running the trail, fostering a deeper appreciation for Singapore's clean water resources.

3 Bedok Green Secondary School engages the community through a self-created water filtration device

In support of SWWD, Bedok Green Secondary School will be engaging the public at Our Tampines Hub on 9 March through a self-created water filtration device! Said to be used in the pre 1960s era, the hands-on activity allows participants to reflect on how far Singapore has come in our water journey and appreciate how easily we can consume potable water now. Students will also explain the science behind the product.

4 Ngee Ann Secondary School's Art and Innovation Club inspires Water Appreciation through art to the community.

Ngee Ann Secondary School is joining us as a co-creation partner, with its Art and Innovation Club leading a hands-on craft session. Through works of art, participants will create sustainable coasters that highlight water's importance, aligning with this year's theme, "Our Water Makes Every Moment Count." This initiative fosters creativity, deepens appreciation for Singapore's water journey.
